Old Baldy Quilters have experimented with fabric print transfer, hand dyeing fabric and ribbons, combinations of herringbone, cretan, buttonhole, fly, feather, lazy daisy, chain stitches, french and colonial knots, ribbon embroidery and flowers and beading.
